HMGP Updates

- DR-4468: Hurricane Dorian – NOFA will be published after the rule change
- FM-5307: declared for Santa Rosa, Walton, and Collier counties
 - Lock-In Ceiling: \$1,899,043
 - NOFA will be published after the rule change



HMGP Updates

- DR-4399 Hurricane Michael
 - We are continuing our reviews of the applications
 - We will send Requests for Information (RFI) to the point of contact on the application if we need anything
 - Total approved: \$2,268,110 (1%)



HMGP Updates

- DR-4280 Hurricane Hermine:
 - Total approved: \$7,742,259 (61.6%)
- DR-4283 Hurricane Matthew:
 - Total approved: \$20,386,499 (41.7%)
- 2017 Wildfires:
 - Total approved: \$1,276,933 (75.1%)



HMGP Updates

- DR-4337 Hurricane Irma:
 - Total approved: \$202,295,662 (35.8%)
 - Projects obligated: 419
 - Projects pending: 92
 - Funds reserved for Phase II projects: \$181.4 million
 - Total approved + reserved for Phase II: 68% of funds

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Non-Disaster Update – FY 2019

- Flood Mitigation Assistance (FMA) – FY 2019
 - Identified for Further Review: 4
 - Awarded: 1
- Pre-Disaster Mitigation (PDM) – FY 2019
 - Identified for Further Review: 4
 - Awarded: 1
- FEMA anticipates having all eligible subapplications awarded by September 30, 2020

Builds Capability

- Capability & capacity-building activities
- In-person non-financial technical assistance
- The Mitigation Action Portfolio – selection of case studies

Increases Flexibility

- Reduces limitations
- Increases caps
- Allows pre-award costs

Streamlines Processes

- New application process through FEMA GO
- Project extensions
- Phased projects

Applicant and Subapplicant Eligibility



Individuals, Businesses, and Non-Profit organizations are *NOT* eligible, but a local government may apply on their behalf.

Hazard Mitigation Assistance Guidance

Hazard Mitigation Grant Program, Pre-Disaster Mitigation Program, and Flood Mitigation Assistance Program

Expanded Eligibility includes:

- Project scoping
- Building code projects
- Additional activities for wildfire and wind implementation (DRRA Section 1205)
- Earthquake early warning (DRRA Section 1233)

NOTE: FEMA P-2055, *Post-disaster Building Safety Evaluation Guidance*

Projects Must:

- Be cost-effective
- Reduce/eliminate risk and damage from future natural hazards
- Meet latest two consensus codes (i.e. 2015 or 2018 international building code)
- Align with Hazard Mitigation Plan
- Meet all environmental and historic preservation requirements

Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities

Priorities

- Incentivize:
 - Public infrastructure projects
 - Projects that mitigate risk to one or more lifelines
 - Projects that incorporate nature-based solutions
- Increase funding to Applicants that facilitate the adoption and enforcement of the latest published editions of building codes

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Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities

- Funding Caps
 - State Set-Aside: \$600,000
 - National Competition: \$50million per subapplication (per project)
- Cost Share
 - 75% federal / 25% non-federal

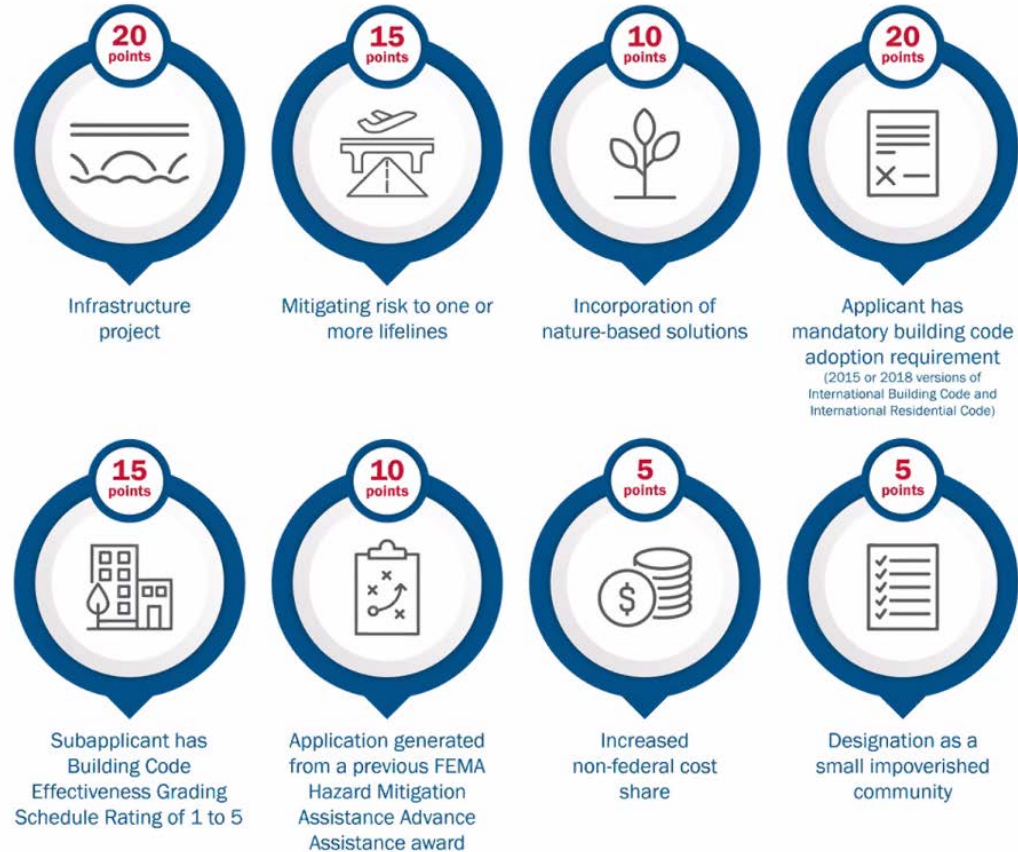



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Flood Factor Tool

- First Street Foundation
 - Non-profit research and technology group developed this free online tool
 - Past, present, and future flood risk of every home and property in contiguous US
 - Takes rainfall, storm surge, and sea level risk into account, which sets it apart from FEMA Flood Risk Mapping Program

Note: Not all flood risk tools will offer the same features or be 100% accurate. The Division shares multiple flood risk tools to augment existing mitigation efforts and allow individuals to identify the best tool for their use.
