RESOLUTION NO. 16-03 IRV

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE INDIAN RIDGE VILLAS COMMON FACILTIES DISTRICT APPROVING THE READOPTION OF THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017 BUDGET TO ACCOUNT FOR THE FUND BALANCE; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS AND SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the Indian Ridge Villas Common Facilities District (the "District") has adopted a budget for FY17; and

WHEREAS, the District had a FY15 fund balance of \$63,157 based on the FY15 audit and

WHEREAS, the Board did not recognize the additional fund balance of \$15,972 in FY16; and

WHEREAS, the Board wants to recognize the additional funds of \$15,972 in their FY17 budget; and

WHEREAS, the District has an adopted FY17 fund balance budget of \$39,237 which will be revised to \$55,209; and

WHEREAS, the Board has conducted a public hearing to readopt the FY17 budget to account for the additional fund balance and provide for expenditures of said revenue as detailed in the attached Schedule A - Budget Amendment; and

WHEREAS, as required by the terms of the Master Ordinance, notice of a public hearing has been published in a newspaper generally circulated within the County; the proof of publication is attached hereto as Appendix B.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE INDIAN RIDGE VILLAS COMMON FACILITIES DISTRICT:

SECTION 1. RE-ADOPTION OF THE FINAL BUDGET. The final District budget for Fiscal Year 2016-2017 as amended and detailed in Schedule A is hereby re-approved and readopted. There are hereby appropriated out of anticipated revenue and balances brought forward, all funds and monies necessary to meet the appropriations and reserves stipulated by and in said budget.

SECTION 2. CONFLICTS AND SEVERABILITY. All sections or parts of sections of all resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause or provisions of this Resolution is held unconstitutional, inoperative, or void by a court of competent jurisdiction, such holding shall not affect the remainder of the Resolution.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
