Project Background

- Highly congested intersection
- Fly-over project (ultimate solution) in design phase
 - Approximately \$120 million total cost (construction and right of way)
- Partial funding for right of way and unfunded for construction currently programmed for fly-over project
- Request by MetroPLAN Orlando to evaluate options to accelerate implementation of an interim improvement project


- Heavy Existing Congestion


- To improve operations and safety


Project Benefits


AM INTERSECTION DELAY


